

RCMP IZZY DOLL

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They cannot be bought or sold".*

Note: Finished height should be approximately 6". Face colours should be natural, etc. shades of brown (light, medium or dark), cream, light pink, peach, black etc.

Materials: Suggested Yarn: Patons Astra, DK weight
Colours - Black; Navy; School Bus Yellow; Cardinal (red);
Cream; Med. Tan and Dark Tan This yarn is the most accurate to the RCMP uniform colours.
Needles: 2 ¾ mm or 3mm. Crochet hook 3 mm.



****See option below for separate attached arms and female officer.***

Dress Congress Boots: With black yarn cast on 16 sts.

Row 1 - increase to 32 sts. (Increase by knitting into front & back of each stitch)

Rows 2, 3 & 4 knit

Dress Pants: Attach navy yarn and cut two strands of yellow approx. 18 " long

Row 1 – Knit Row 2 – Purl

Row 3 – K 8 sts in navy, attach yellow and K1 st, K14 sts navy, attach yellow and K1 st, K8 sts navy

Rows 4,6,8,10,12,14&16 - Purl changing colours as in row 3

Rows 5,7,9,11,13& 15 - Knit changing colours as in row 3

Tunic/Red Serge: Change to red and cut two strands of dark brown approx. 18" long

Row 1 – K7 sts in red, attach brown and K3 sts, K12 sts red, attach brown and K3 sts, K7 sts red

Row 2 – P7 sts red, 4 sts brown, 10 sts red, 4 sts brown, 7 sts red (I carry the red across the brown in back)

Row 3 – Knit 7 sts red, K 4 sts dk. brown, K 10 sts red, K 4 sts dk. brown, K 7 sts red

Row 4 – same as row 2

Row 5 – Knit row in red

Rows 6 to 20 – stocking sts in red

Head:

Change to cream (or whatever colour you have selected for face)

Rows 1 to 12 – stocking st

Row 13 – K3, K2 tog, (K4, K2tog) 4 times, Knit to end of row (27 sts)

Rows -14, 16,& 18 Purl

Row 15 – K2, K2tog, (K3, K2tog) 4 times, Knit to end of row (22 sts)

Row 17 – (K2, K2tog) across the row (17 sts)

Row 19 – (K1, K2tog) 5 times, K2tog. Draw yarn through remaining sts.

Head: Female Officer

Row 1 Knit (skin colour)
Row 2 Purl (skin colour)
Row 3 Knit 3 (hair colour); knit 26 (skin colour); knit 3 (hair colour)
Row 4 Purl 6 (hair colour); purl 20 (skin colour); purl 6 (hair colour)
Row 5 Knit 8 (hair colour); knit 16 (skin colour); knit 8 (hair colour)
Row 6 Purl 10 (hair colour); purl 12 (skin colour); purl 10 (hair colour)
Row 7 Knit 11 (hair colour); knit 10 (skin colour); knit 11 (hair colour)
Row 8 Purl 12 (hair colour); purl 8 (skin colour); purl 12 (hair colour)
Row 9 Knit 13 (hair colour); knit 6 (skin colour); purl 13 (hair colour)
Row 10 Purl 14 (hair colour);
purl 1 (skin colour); purl 1 (hair colour); purl 1 (skin colour); purl 15 (hair colour)
Row 11 Purl 32 (hair colour)
Row 12 Purl 32 (hair colour)

Continue in hair colour decreasing stitches as per Rows 13 – 19 above (Head)

(Optional bun: Cast on approx.. 40 stitches in hair colour; Knit 1 row; Cast off , form into a bun and attach to back of head after Stetson, beret or cap has been attached).

*Finishing:

- Body: Sew together back seam. Stuff head. Weave a single strand of matching yarn across the first row. Draw up yarn to form neck and tie tightly. With red yarn define arms by using small vertical stitches through both layers starting from a couple of stitches over from the inside of top of gloves to about 3 rows below neck. The arms should be about the width of your little finger. Stuff arms and chest.

Define legs in same manner with small stitches using black then navy from middle of bottom edge to a few rows below waist. Stuff and sew up bottom edge.

Define ankles by running gathering stitches around top of each boot and pulling slightly.

Define waist by running a red horizontal gathering stitch above gloves on body only, making sure not to catch arms. (Gather across body in front, through body to back, across back, through body to front and pull to make waist.)

Belt and Sam Brown: With 3 mm crochet hook make a chain of dark brown yarn approx. 45 to 55 chains. Sew on to doll going over left shoulder to across waist only (don't go across arms) in both front and back.

Attach Stetson and embroidery face.

INTERNATIONAL POLICING: RCMP Peacekeepers do not wear a Red Tunic. When making an international police doll, you can use, black for shoes (knit 4 rows 32 sts); blue/navy for pants (stocking st 16 rows); beige for short-sleeved or long sleeved shirts (stocking sts 14 rows). Suggested yarns: Patons Astra, colours Black for shoes, Navy for pants, med. Tan for shirt, Aran for head.

To make short sleeve shirts use beige or med. Tan coloured yarn:

Row 1 - Knit 4 sts in beige colour, knit 8 sts in flesh colour (whatever colour your using for face), knit 8 sts in beige, knit 8 sts in flesh colour, knit 4 sts in beige

Row 2 - Purl 4 sts in beige, purl 8 sts in flesh colour, purl 8 sts in beige, purl 8 sts in flesh colour, purl 4 sts in beige

Rows 3 to 8 repeat as above

Rows 9 to 14 knit 32 sts in beige

Option: Arms made separately and attached.

Arms (make 2) With Dark Tan (brown) cast on 6 stitches

Row 1 Knit

Row 2 Purl

Row 3 Knit 1, K into front & back of next st (repeat across) 9 sts

Row 4 Purl

Row 5 Change to red colour and stocking stitch for 14 rows

Row 17 K1, K2 together (repeat across) 6 sts

Row 18 Purl. Place sts on a separate needle or holder

Dress Congress Boots: With black yarn cast on 16 sts.

Row 1 - increase to 32 sts. (Increase by knitting into front & back of each stitch)

Rows 2,3 & 4 knit

Dress Pants: Attach navy yarn and cut two strands of yellow approx. 18 " long

Row 1 – Knit Row 2 – Purl

Row 3 – K 8 sts in navy, attach yellow and K1 st, K14 sts navy, attach yellow and K1 st, K8 sts navy

Rows 4,6,8,10,12,14 & 16 - Purl changing colours as in row 3

Rows 5,7,9,11,13 & 15 - Knit changing colours as in row 3



Tunic/Red Serge: Change to red

Rows 1 to 6 stocking stitch

Row 7 – change to dark brown & knit

Row 8 – Purl

Row 9 – change back to red & knit

Rows 10 – 18 stocking stitch starting with a purl row

Row 19 – With right side facing attach arms as follows: Knit 6 sts, hold arm in front of shirt and knit the next 6 sts of the shirt and arm together, knit 8 sts of shirt, holding second arm in front of the shirt knit the next 6 sts of the shirt and arm together, knit remaining 6 sts of shirt

Row 20 – Purl

Change to face colour and continue making head as instructed above in first pattern on page 1

***Finishing:**

- Sew and stuff arms first starting at the bottom of hand. After sewing and stuffing the body of the doll, tack arms part way down the body so that they don't stick straight out at the sides.

- Body: Sew together back seam (head to toe). Stuff head. Weave a single strand of matching yarn across the first row. Draw up yarn to form neck and tie tightly. Stuff red tunic area. Starting at the bottom of boots define legs by sewing small stitches up the middle through both layers to the bottom of the tunic and then stuff. Sew up bottom edge. With black yarn, weave a single strand around the top row of the boots to form ankles. Define waist by running a length of dark brown yarn through the belt on the tunic and draw in slightly.

- **Sam Brown:** With 3 mm crochet hook make a chain of dark brown yarn approx. 38 chains. Fold up one end for a small triangle to represent a gun holster. Sew on to doll by stitching/attaching to body under right arm, from right side of belt (with holster), over left shoulder, across back to right side of belt at waist. Continue finishing by making desired hat and embroidering face.

RCMP Izzy Doll Hats:

Stetson

Suggested yarn, Patons Astra Med. Tan and Dark Tan

Using medium tan colour cast on 36 sts.

Row 1 – Knit. Cut yarn and attach dark Tan colour

Row 2 – Purl this row only with dark Tan colour. Cut yarn, and attach med. Tan colour and continue

Row 3 – Knit

Row 4 – Purl

Row 5 – (K1, K2tog) across row

Row 6 – Purl

Row 7 – Knit

Row 8 – Purl

Row 9 – (K2tog) across row

Row 10 – Purl

Row 11 – Knit

Row 12 – Purl then draw yarn through all stitches leaving a long enough tail to sew up back seam later.

With right side facing, pick up and knit 34 sts along cast on edge. In garter stitch (knit every row) knit another 9 rows then cast off. Fold brim up and whip stitch to the cast-on edge to form brim. Sew back seam and attach to head.

UN Peacekeeper Tilly Hat (International Policing) :

Use UN Peacekeeper blue coloured yarn. Suggested yarn: Patons Astra Med. Blue

Crown: Cast on 31 sts.

Rows 1 to 8 - Knit every row

Row 9 – (K1, slip 1, K1, PSSO) repeat to last stitch, K1

Row 10 – Knit

Row 11 – K2, (slip 1, K1, PSSO) repeat to last stitch, K1

Row 12 – (slip 1, K1, PSSO) repeat to end

Break yarn and thread through remaining sts.

Brim:

Row 1 - With right side facing, pick up and knit 29 sts from first row of Crown.

Row 2 - (K1, K into front & back of next st), repeat to last st, K1 (43 sts)

Row 3 - Knit

Row 4 - (K2, K into front & back of next st), repeat to last st, K1

Row 5 - Cast off loosely (can use a larger needle for cast off if desired)

To finish: UN Crest: Embroider a small white circle on front of hat and fill it in, (I used a chain stitch for this and embroidery thread, you can also use a white fine yarn). Sew up back seam and attach to head.

Embroider a face.

UN Peacekeeper Blue Beret

Use UN Peacekeeper blue coloured yarn.

Materials: Suggested Yarn: Patons Astra. Colours – Black & Medium Blue.

To Make: Cast on 25 sts in black colour, then change to blue colour

Row 1 – Knit in blue colour

Row 2 – Purl

Row 3 – Increase: (Knit into the front & back of each st) 24 times; K1 (49 sts)

Row 4 – Purl; Row 5 – Knit; Row 6 – Purl;

Row 7 – Decrease: K9, (K2tog, K3) twice; K11, (K3, K2tog) twice, K9 (45 sts)

Row 8 – Purl

Row 9 – Decrease: K9, (K2tog, K2) twice; K11, (K2, K2tog) twice, K9 (41 sts)

Row 10 – Purl

Row 11– Shape top: (K2, K2tog) to last st., K1 (31 sts)

Row 12 – Purl

Row 13 – (K1, K2tog) to last st., K1 (21 sts)

Row 14 – Purl

Row 15 – (K2tog) to last st., K1 (11 sts) Draw yarn through remaining stitches leaving a long tail of yarn for sewing up the hat after.

To finish: UN Crest: Embroider a small white circle on front of hat and fill it in, (I used a chain stitch for this and embroidery thread, you can also use a white fine yarn). Sew up back seam and attach to head.

Embroider a face.
